STEM Girl Power 2025

Spotlight on Year 10 student, **Sophie Hamilton** as Mossman State High School's STEM Girl Power Ambassador.

Sophie has represented our school through participation in the Department of Education's 2025 STEM Girl Power Camp, which was held on 19 - 23 May in Brisbane. Sixty year 10 students and 10 teachers travelled from all over Queensland to represent their school in Brisbane, where they participated in a variety of events, innovative science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) workshops and networking

Camp students met inspiring role models from diverse fields including, engineering, medicine, chemistry, quantum technologies and mathematical modelling. Camp students explored STEM pathways at an industry location of their choosing (either Cross River Rail, TechnologyOne, the Ecosciences Precinct or the Integrated Pathology Learning Centre) and discussed the importance of STEM communication at the Queensland Museum and Wheel of Brisbane. Students also participated in a variety of hands-on activities, including world-class biomedical research techniques at SPARQ-ed and led science activities with local primary school students.

The camp fostered students' understanding of STEM's significance in society while enhancing their leadership, critical thinking, creativity, collaboration and communication skills. As 2025 STEM Ambassadors, these students will now organise and deliver a STEM event during National Science Week in Term 3 (August 2025). This initiative aims to inspire others to pursue STEM subjects and careers.

Sophie has always demonstrated an interest in improving her learning and seeks out ways to be involved in exciting STEM opportunities. We are proud of how she has represented our school and is a promising young scholar others can look up to.


Professional Bull Riding Workshop

successful in securing a grant through the National Indigenous Australians Agency (NIAA) to create a Reconciliation Garden on our school grounds.

This beautiful, inclusive space has been designed to celebrate all cultures and serve as a shared community space -a place where healing, learning and connection can take root and grow. Open to all, the garden represents the spirit of reconciliation and unity that continues to strengthen within our school and wider Douglas Shire.

The Reconciliation Garden began as a passion project and the brainchild of our much-loved Ag Plot guru, Mr Neil Pacey. With his vision and design, and the grant opportunity identified by staff member Elliot Davidson, the school was given approval to apply – thanks to an already well-established partnership with NIAA, formed through the successful Junior Ranger Program delivered in collaboration with Jabalbina.

Harry Cobb (School Partnership Facilitator) took the lead with this project and identified Rickie Burchill, an incredibly talented local landscape gardener, whose work honoured the spirit and intent of the design and brought Neil's original concept to life. Jabalbina played a key role in making the vision a reality, turning plans into a stunning landscape in just three days. The project was made even more special with the help of past Mossman SHS students who returned to contribute their skills while completing traineeships – a true reflection of community continuity and pride.

The Reconciliation Garden will be officially opened on Monday 4th August, and we warmly welcome representatives from local Elders and Traditional Owners, cluster primary school leaders, and various community organisations to be part of this special event. Each representative will plant a native species in the garden – a living symbol of unity, healing and respect.

This garden is more than just a beautiful space. It marks a key step on our shared journey of reconciliation and celebrates the strength of our school and community coming together as one.

Students have been showing great persistence in evaluating their sources of information, ensuring they use credible primary and secondary sources that can be corroborated and that offer different perspectives. These skills are of the utmost importance in the study of History and also in students' everyday lives as they navigate through misinformation.


